

Around this time last year, I began preparing my move to St. Christina's. Naturally enough, I was excited for my new adventure. But I was also sad. I loved the people I was leaving behind. I was speaking to a brother priest about the mixed emotions of moving and (with a bit of naïve arrogance) I said, "Thankfully, as I leave, I know that all the people of Our Lady of the Ridge — St. Linus really loved me."

My friend, older, with a few more years of priesthood under his belt, laughed hard and said, "No, no they didn't! What, are you crazy? Not everyone loved you!" I was horrified and angry! "What do you mean?" I barked back at him! My brother priest simply replied: "You're human; you have flaws, and you're not everyone's cup of tea! Some people don't like the homilies you give! Some felt you paid no attention to the senior citizens and were always at the school! Some in the school felt like you didn't pay attention to them, too focused on the senior citizens. And on and on...

"Listen," he said to me, "Don't worry about it! 10% of the parish loves you and will remember you fondly. 10% of the parish will be happy you're gone. 80% will really have no opinion whatsoever! They just love the sacraments and support their priests."

After that conversation, I got to thinking, "Am I a failure?" Did I not make a difference in the lives of the people I'm called to serve, even after three years of service as their parish priest? And, most of all, why doesn't everyone like me? After all, I'm a really great guy, aren't I?

I put a lot of thought and prayer in it, and I came to the realization that, no matter what I do and don't do, not every person whom I encounter will absolutely love and adore me! Even if I try to do every single thing right, even if I try to be a really super-nice guy to all, some people will not like me! Maybe I remind them of someone else. Perhaps I bring to mind a bully or a pest from elementary school.

And, maybe (just maybe) it's actually just me; perhaps I can be annoying, obnoxious, unthinking, and hurtful, both unintentionally, and, in my sinful nature, intentionally. There can be a million compliments given after a homily, but the one critique, that's what stings. And that's what I'll remember! It's all part of fallen human nature. It's a simple fact — not everyone will always like me. And, sadly, if I'm honest with myself, there are some that I'm not too crazy about, either!

No one person should be, and can be, universally loved. The Lord Jesus Christ is the only perfectly just man. He's the only one worthy of adoration. As we see in the Gospel today, even Jesus was not universally loved. If the Lord Jesus, He who alone is perfect, cannot be accepted and loved by all, why should we, humble creatures, expect anything different?

For those of us who are ordained as priests for God's people, we want to be liked. Let's face it, being liked helps bring people to Church and to the Lord Jesus. But it's also nice to be liked!

Yet, the task of all Christians is not to be liked and admired. The task for all of us is to be good and just. Each of us is called to be Christ to all whom we meet. Our task is about being Jesus Christ to others, even when we are going to be considered obnoxious and going to be rejected. Our job, in spite of our flaws and failings, is to cultivate the peace of Jesus Christ to our families, our parish, our community, our world. Pray for that grace, in spite of our insecurities and deficiencies. And be amazed at all that God does for you.

Lenten Regulations

Following are the regulations for **abstinence** and **fasting** to be observed by Catholics during Lent:

A fast and abstinence is prescribed for Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Fasting is observed by all Catholics be-

tween 18 and 59. Those bound by this may take only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid food between meals is not permitted.

Abstinence from meat is to be observed by all Catholics 14 years and older on all Fridays of Lent

By the threefold discipline of fasting, almsgiving, and prayer, the Church keeps Lent from Ash Wednesday until the evening of Holy Thursday. All of the faithful and the catechumens should undertake serious practice of these three traditions. Failure to observe penitential days totally or a substantial number of such days must be considered serious.

Why Do We Do That? — Catholic Life Explained

Palm Sunday

Question:

Where do Palm Sunday palms come from and where should they go?

Answer:

The Palm Sunday celebration has ancient origins. Beginning the liturgy "outside" the church, we symbolically reenact Christ's entry into Jerusalem. The crowds in ancient Israel waved palm branches – a symbol of royalty – to welcome Jesus. These days, obtaining palms takes a lot of planning and coordination, as hundreds of thousands of churches worldwide need them on the same day! Many in the United States order palms from Florida, California, Texas, or Central America. Many companies stress the sustainability of their production and the just wages paid to their workers.

The palms used on Palm Sunday are blessed at Mass. This means they shouldn't end up in the trash! Many people weave palms into crosses or families display them in their homes. If you do not plan on displaying your palms throughout the year, they should be burned, buried, or left at the church. In the final case, the palms are burned to provide the ashes for next year's Ash Wednesday service.


