

This Thursday, April 10<sup>th</sup>, our parish will be celebrating a Lenten Evening of Adoration and Confession. Beginning at 7PM, there will be Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, Adoration, a short Lenten reflection, followed by the opportunity for individual confession. I will preach a short reflection recalling some of the gifts that God has given to me through the Sacrament of Confession.

Here's a sneak preview: In my twenties, during a period of recklessness and rebellion, I neglected my faith. I finally had enough and stumbled into St. Peter's in the Loop on Madison St. I didn't know why, but I <u>needed</u> to go to Confession. I hadn't gone in years, and I wasn't quite sure what to do or say. I entered the confessional, knelt, and after a few deep breaths, I stammered out my sins. I confessed some of the things that hurt me most. In the quiet and dark confessional, the priest listened, counseled, prayed, and absolved me. I was afraid of what he'd

think of me! The priest was a good father. He didn't want to judge. He simply wanted to give me all I needed that day — an understanding of God's great love for me.

Enshrined in my mind, to this day, is the unmistakable sense of relief that I had as I walked from that confessional. Mixed with the tears streaming down my face, was the definite knowledge of God's love and mercy. I knew God, my Father, loved me. I was in good hands.

Now, all these years later, I confess most often to Fr. Deo Rosales. I see Fr. Deo almost every Monday. Sure, he hears the worst of me in Confession. But we also spend time learning, chatting, eating, and laughing outside of the confessional. While that sort of intimacy can feel awkward at first, after a while it begins to feel gloriously normal — and Christ-like. After all, Jesus, who knew all the sins of His friends, laughed with them and loved them in their frailties.

One of the fears that kept me from Confession when I was away from the Sacraments was the simple fear of messing up. No one wants to step into the confessional and then sit awkwardly — saying and doing the wrong things. Of course, the priest isn't going to mind, he's used to that. We have heard confessions from the 'rambling and eager' to the 'short and to the point' types. We've heard confessions from people who haven't been to the Sacrament in weeks, months, years, and even decades. (I once heard a confession from a person who hadn't been in 50 years. I think I was more excited than he was!) No matter what you've got to confess, it's likely that nothing you do or say in the confessional will surprise your priest.

Simply... Don't be afraid! If you haven't been to Confession in a long time, your soul is aching for it. If it's been longer than a year, the idea of confessing your sins might feel pretty overwhelming. Trust me, a good and thorough Confession will give you great joy. Go deep and get off your chest all that needs to be forgiven. The feeling of having that great weight lifted is absolutely unforgettable.

My friend, St. Augustine was once a 'well practiced sinner' who became one of the greatest of saints through regular prayer, persistence, and the Sacrament of Confession. He said, "Whoever confesses his sins is already working with God. The beginning of good works is the confession of evil works. Do the truth and come to the light."

Let's confess our sins, move toward holiness, and come to the light. I hope to see you on Thursday.



## **Lenten Regulations**

Following are the regulations for **abstinence** and **fasting** to be observed by Catholics during Lent:

A fast and abstinence is prescribed for Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Fasting is observed by all Catholics between 18 and 59. Those bound by this may take only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid food between meals is not permitted.

Abstinence from meat is to be observed by all Catholics 14 years and older on all Fridays of Lent.

By the threefold discipline of fasting, almsgiving, and prayer, the Church keeps Lent from Ash Wednesday until the evening of Holy Thursday. All of the faithful and the catechumens should undertake serious practice of these three traditions. Failure to observe penitential days totally or a substantial number of such days must be considered serious.

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

As we begin our Lenten journey marked with prayer, fasting and almsgiving, I am writing to let you know that on Ash Wednesday a Senate committee passed a bill, Senate Bill 9, that would legalize assisted suicide in Illinois. This would make it legal for a physician to prescribe an array of lethal drugs to a person diagnosed with a terminal disease who requests to end his or her life. In addition to asking you to offer your Lenten sacrifices to protect life, I ask that you take action by writing, calling or e-mailing your state elected official to vote "NO" on this legislation. There is also legislation pending in the House, House Bill 1328 as you will see at <a href="https://www.ilcatholic.org">www.ilcatholic.org</a> or by calling 217-528-9200.

The involvement of insurance companies is alarming. In fact, in states with legalized suicide, there are documented cases of people being denied life-saving medical treatment by insurance companies in lieu of the much cheaper option of life-ending drugs. The poor and those with disabilities are particularly in jeopardy as they are the most vulnerable to such abuses. Every major national organization that represents people with disabilities is opposed to assisted suicide. There is no way to prevent the vulnerable from being coerced or intimidated to end their lives once this assisted suicide is legal. There are simply too many documented cases of the vulnerable being coerced or intimidated into ending their life.

Proponents argue that this legislation will end suffering at the end of life. We all agree that no one should needlessly suffer or have to watch a loved one experience unnecessary pain and suffering. Fortunately, there are now effective ways to make a person more comfortable at the end of life through palliative care, which utilizes physician-led teams to care for the whole person – physically, emotionally, socially and spiritually – to relieve the symptoms and the stress related to serious illness and side effects of treatment.

The American Medical Association (AMA) has summed up the case against assisted suicide well: "Physician assisted suicide is fundamentally incompatible with the physician's role as healer, would be difficult or impossible to control, and would provide serious societal risks."

Assisted suicide is not the compassionate solution for those who are suffering. Through palliative care, expanded access to mental health care, and stronger family and community support, providers and families are finding better ways to accompany these people compassionately that shows love and respect for the dignity each human life.


