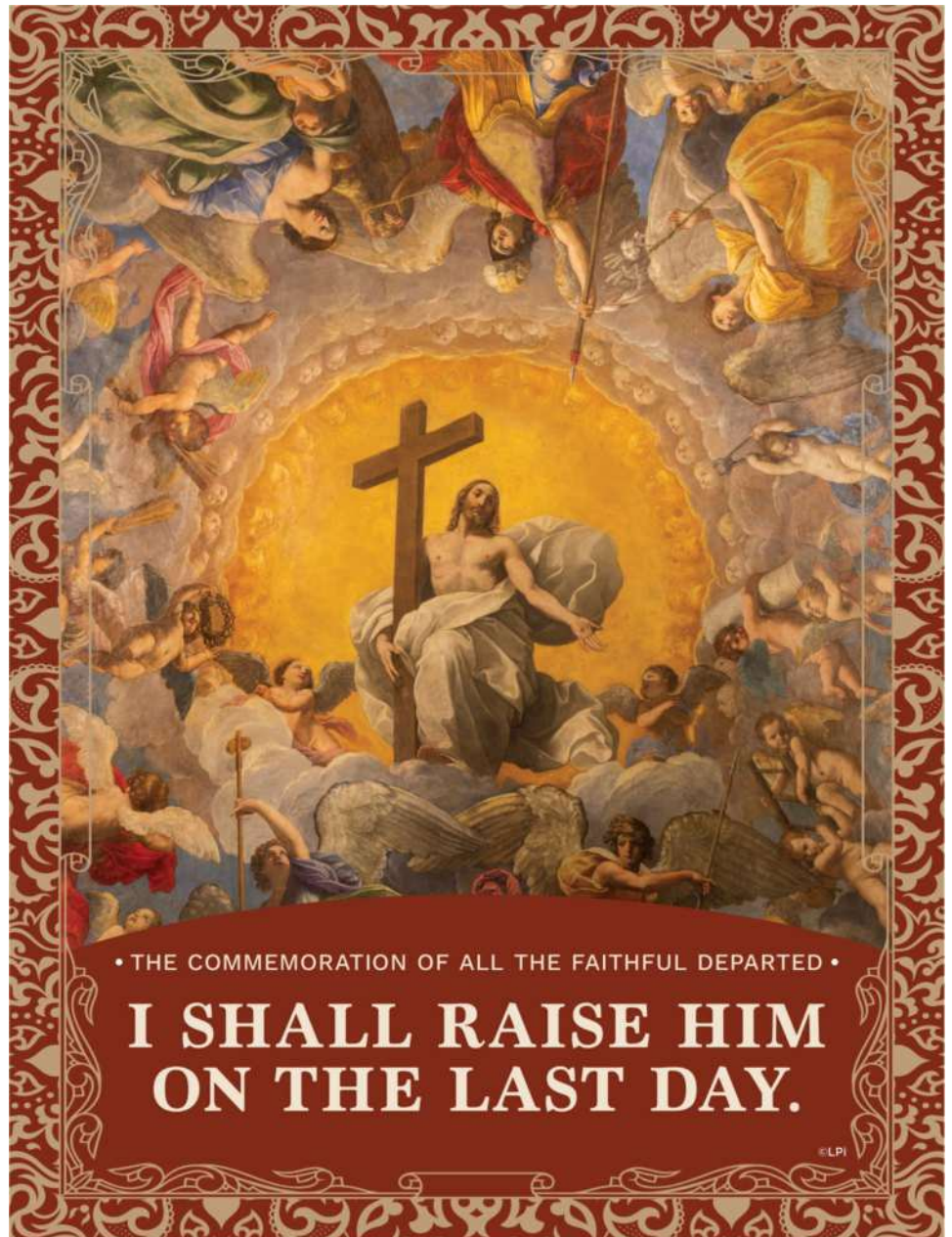

A WORD FROM Fr. Ryan

November is traditionally an important month to pray for those in Purgatory. And this weekend in particular, we celebrate the Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed — commonly remembered as All Souls' Day.

Let's face it: we will all die. When we die there are only three options. For the perfect: Heaven. For unrepentant sinners: Hell. And for those on the way to Heaven, but in need of a little help getting there: Purgatory.

If a person is in Heaven, they don't need our prayers. They are the ones praying for us. If a person is in Hell, no prayer of ours could help them now. If a person is in Purgatory — purifying their soul and preparing themselves for Heaven — the greatest gift we can give them is our prayer.

It's only normal to pray for those who have gone before us. Imagine for a minute: You're standing next to a river with a strong current. A boy in the water is carried away by the current and drowning. You could save him by just stretching out your hand and grabbing him. Wouldn't you help? Of course you would! And when you have saved this boy's life, as long as he lived he would always remember what you had done for him. You could be sure that he would always be happy to help you in any way he could.

Well, the Holy Souls in Purgatory are in a river of purification right now. It's not necessarily comfortable. But you can definitely help them to get out of there with your prayer. Like the boy in the river, they can't do anything for themselves. They endure and pray an awful lot but, in Purgatory, they can't offer those prayers for themselves. Only we and the saints in Heaven can pray for them and help them to get into Paradise.

If we pray for them, the Holy Souls will be tremendously grateful. They will remember for all eternity that it was our prayers that helped them to enter Heaven. And here on earth, we will feel their powerful intercession. This is a win-win situation: we pray for them, they pray for us.

One day St. Padre Pio had a vision of a Holy Soul in Purgatory asking for prayers to go to Paradise. St. Padre Pio promised to offer Mass for this Poor Soul the next morning. When that Soul heard that he had to wait he cried out: "Cruel!" Then he wept and disappeared. "That complaint," said St. Pio, "produced in me a wound to the heart that I have felt and I will feel my whole life. In fact, I would have been able to immediately send that soul to Heaven, but I condemned him to remain another night in the entanglement of Purgatory."

Frankly, this is basic Catholic theology. And often, this reality has been glossed over to relieve us and "make us feel better." It hasn't worked. Christians haven't been this spiritually unsettled since the beginning of the Church. The reality of Purgatory might make us a bit uncomfortable. Rightly so. We should let this discomfort move us to strive to be saints ourselves. And, we should let the discomfort move our hearts to deeper prayer filled with compassion and love for those in Purgatory. Lord, let them be welcomed into Paradise!

Mary, Mother of the Holy Souls, use our prayers and sacrifices to help your children get into Heaven.

Oremus pro invicem!



Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed

We Remember

As we approach November 2nd, the Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed, our priests, Fr. Ryan Brady and Fr. Wayne Svida, along with our St. Christina Parish family, offer our continued prayers and support to all who have experienced a recent loss.

We Celebrate

On Monday, November 3rd during the 7:00 p.m. Mass in church, we will have a memorial of our faithful departed. Our memorial service will take place immediately following the homily of the Mass. The names of parishioners and those buried from St. Christina Church since last October 29, 2024 will be read.

Upon your arrival for the All Souls Day memorial Mass you will receive a candle having the name of your deceased loved one. You and your family will then bring the candle up into the sanctuary and place it on the table which has been prepared on the Blessed Mother side, and there it will be lit. **It will be important to be in church before 7:00 p.m. to allow time for family members to bring their candle up into the sanctuary before Mass starts.**

If you would also like to have a photo of your loved one placed in the sacred space during November, you may bring the photo when you come for a weekend Mass or a morning Mass and place it in one of the marked containers in the vestibule of the church (containers will be available starting October 18th). Photos may also be dropped off at the rectory. Please be sure to put the name on the back, along with your phone number. If you bring a picture with you on November 3rd, simply bring it up to the ladies in front. You are then welcome to leave the picture and candle in church until November 23rd, or you may take them with you after Mass on November 3rd. How fitting to then have the candle in a place of honor for your Thanksgiving Day celebration, on the dining room table or in an appropriate setting.

We Believe

We invite you, your family, and anyone who wishes, to please join us in praying for and remembering our deceased loved ones. While we no longer experience their physical presence with us, our faith tells us we will one day be reunited. Life has changed for them, for their earthly journey is completed and they are at peace. In communion with them, we journey forward in faith. Why Do We Do That? — Catholic Life Explained

Resurrection of the Dead

Question:

What do Catholics believe about the resurrection of the dead?

Answer:

Every Sunday, we proclaim in the Creed that we believe “in the resurrection of the body.” Does that mean Christ’s resurrection or our own? Both! Jesus’ resurrection is part of the work of salvation, but it’s also a sign of what’s to come. While death separates our bodies and our souls, this was not the intention of God when He first created us. It’s an effect of original sin. At the end of time, our bodies and our souls will be reunited.

Scientifically, we may have questions about this, since bodies decompose over the course of centuries. Or what about the saints, whose relics are spread around the earth? How the resurrection will happen is a mystery. But we know that our resurrected body will be *our* body. If we are in heaven, our body will be in a glorified state. Some theologians speculate what this glorification will be like based on Jesus’ resurrected body. Will we be able to walk through walls? Will we eat, since Jesus broke bread with his disciples? We don’t really know the answers to these questions. We do know, however, that we will be free from the effects of the fall (such as sickness and pain) and physical defects that occurred in life. Christ redeems us as whole persons, body and soul!

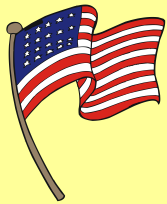
St. Christina Parish Domestic Violence Outreach

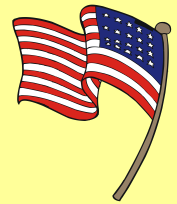
