A WORD FROM Fr. Ryan

Jesus is King of the Heaven and Earth. Jesus is King even of the whole Universe! King of the entire creation. But His Kingship is not obvious. His crown was given Him by Pontius Pilate on the day of His greatest suffering — it was made of thorns. Jesus, our King was killed on the day of His Coronation. But, as we well know, He rose from the dead. Still though, over the past two millennia, many people who have proclaimed Jesus' Kingship have been killed as well. Where was their King — our King — when they died? Many people wonder also, “if Jesus is truly King of Earth... why is there so much evil in His Kingdom?” And, “what is the King of the Universe doing about it?”

J.R.R. Tolkien was the great English writer of “The Hobbit” and “The Lord of the Rings” trilogy. He was also a very devout and holy Catholic man. His father died when Tolkien was three years old. His mother, when Tolkien was twelve. In his 20s Tolkien served the British Army in the First World War. In “The Great War,” Tolkien fought in many violent battles and he lost many dear friends. With all that tragedy and violence in his life, where did Tolkien see Jesus Christ, King of the Universe?!

J.R.R. Tolkien once referred to God as a great Composer. At the beginning of time, God composed the most beautiful music. Knowing our instruments and our skills, He composed a perfect piece of music for His creatures to interpret. But, of course, we are free. We can follow the music however we like. The devil and many other skilled angels decided not to follow the music as written. So, they made up their own melody to increase their own glory. In Tolkien's mind, the awful noise of the devil and all evildoers clashed with God's original composition and there was a violent war of sound.

But that didn't stop God. He is Almighty: God is the Perfect Composer. Tolkien reasoned that God knows what the devil and his followers are going to play! So God has arranged a new musical score that wraps all that noise into a more beautiful composition and the result is even more harmonious than before.

God needs our help though. You and I need to play that new musical piece for Him. We, by living our Christian life, have to play His “symphony” the best we can. We've got to strive to be saints! When we work, when we pray, when we help people and serve others, even in our rest or leisure, we are playing that “symphony” the best we can, and we are making Jesus King of our lives. With our Christian lives we will show that Jesus is King. And all those who don't want Jesus to reign will have to wake up to the Truth: Jesus is King and His Kingdom will have no end.

Long live Christ the King!

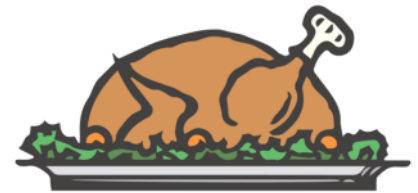
As we did last year, all the turkey breasts will be prepared "in-house." The traditional feast will also include a pumpkin dessert.

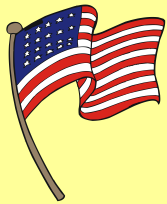
St. Christina Parish Domestic Violence Outreach



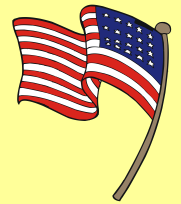
