A WORD FROM Fr. Ryan

This weekend, we celebrate the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica in Rome. It's a big deal. After all, this feast day suppresses what would ordinarily be the 32nd Week in Ordinary Time. What's that all about? I'll get to that in a second. But first, let's look at Jesus' odd behavior in today's Gospel.

We are not used to seeing Jesus so upset: making a whip of cords, driving people out of the Temple, and overturning tables. Jesus is normally patient and loving with everyone, including sinners. Today, though, He is angry because there is a lack of respect for God in His own Temple.

Jesus' Real Presence in the Blessed Sacrament remains in church tabernacles 24/7. Because of this, we should have proper reverence while inside of a church. We should dress modestly and appropriately, arrive on time (to the best of our ability), silence our phones, and (for men) remove our hats. On entering our church, we should bless ourselves with holy water and genuflect (or bow) towards the tabernacle before sitting in the pew. All these things remind us that we are in a sacred place, built for a sacred purpose.

Imagine going to the movies and stuffing yourself with popcorn, Raisinets, and Slushies. But you never actually watched the film! That's what happened in the Gospel when people came to the Temple and didn't pay due attention to God. Still today, some can fall into the trap of going to church and talking with everyone they meet, except to God. Some people forget that the "house of God" is a house of prayer. God is Really Present in our church. The Tabernacle is not some elaborate decoration. It is God's home. Let's not miss the opportunity to lift our hearts vertically to Heaven while enjoying the company that surrounds us horizontally at our left and right.

Lastly, today is the anniversary of the dedication of the Basilica of St. John Lateran. "The Lateran" was dedicated in 324AD and has been the Cathedral Church of the Pope ever since. And, in a way, She is our Cathedral too. On the façade of the Church reads an inscription: *Omnium Ecclesiarum Urbis et Orbis Mater et Caput* — Mother and Head of all Churches of the City and of the World.

Let's remember on this feast day that God gives us the great Basilica of St. John Lateran *AND* St. Christina Church first and foremost as a home for us to grow closer to God. Then, secondarily, these beautiful churches are a place where we grow closer to each other.



With that being said, would you like the opportunity to see the Basilica of St. John Lateran in person? Would you like to pray in the Basilica of St. Christina, built over her tomb? Well, due to the extraordinary demand, we've increased the number of openings for our **100th Anniversary Parish Pilgrimage to Italy**. We'll visit the most beautiful churches in the world. 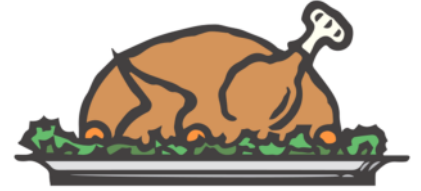

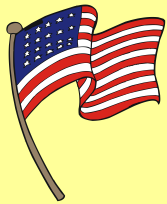
St. Christina Parish Domestic Violence Outreach



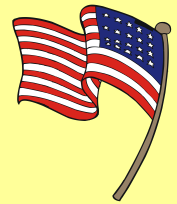
